Museum hosts a lunchtime talk on '220 Years of the Ordnance Survey Map' by Stuart Dunbar, OS Senior Surveyor. The UK Ordnance Survey has led the world in accurate mapping, and the OS series offers up-to-date clarity, including a large-scale detailed series for walkers. No excuse to get lost!




Another interest is the historical maps you may find **for your area** on [www.maps.nls.uk/os](http://www.maps.nls.uk/os), which displays some of the OS maps that will doubtless feature in the talk. The 1858 survey shows the West Greenhill gas tanks, with estate land beside it belonging to Greenhill House. So part of this estate has returned to recreation again with the new football stadium. Where the business units are now on Underwood Road was Underwood Park beside the railway. King Street had continuous housing, doubtless tenements, on the west side, to beyond the present flyover, including where our hall is at No. 5. You can have a fascinating search for your own patch as it once was: perhaps some clues to things you might dig up outside.



As we travel through this world, at some time the question arises, perhaps when a friend dies, or illness strikes, Where am I heading after this life? We may have a clear course here, but what about beyond? Only one map in the world claims to answer that with certainty—the Bible, written for our spiritual guidance. Many have followed its moral lead and found blessing. Surety comes when you meet and accept the Saviour of sinners, who said **"I am the way, the truth and the life"** (John. 14:6). # 日本語



## Chicken Jambalaya

- 500g skinless chicken thighs
- 200g chorizo (smoked sausage)
- 1 onion finely diced
- 1 green pepper finely diced
- 1 tin chopped tomatoes
- 3 cloves garlic crushed
- 1 tsp cumin
- 1/2 tsp turmeric

- 1/2 tsp smoked paprika
- 1 tbs fresh thyme
- 3 tbs fresh parsley chopped
- 1 red pepper finely diced
- 1 1/2 litres chicken stock
- 400g brown basmati rice
- sour cream and sliced spring onions to serve

### Method

1. Cut the thighs in half and season before browning in a hot pan, add the chopped chorizo and cook for 3-4 mins. Add the onion, and peppers and cook for a further 5 mins. Add the garlic, bay leaves, turmeric, paprika and cumin and continue cooking for a couple of mins, add the white wine and tomato's.
2. Add the rice to the pan and stir through, pour in the boiling stock and bring to a simmer. cover with a lid and cook for 50-60 mins. or until the rice is cooked, adding more stock if required, Stir through parsley, spring onions and season.
